CLASSROOM RESOURCES

The students and teachers at the following schools will receive these classroom resources:



Humanex Academy will receive funds for multisensory classroom materials to help support learning disabled students with day-to-day learning.

The foundation will also provide funds for seminar classes for juniors and seniors at Humanex Academy to help them prepare for post-secondary life. They will receive instruction and materials designed to help students with learning disabilities strengthen their self-advocacy, executive functioning, and life skills. The seminars will also help students navigate the transition from high school to college or a work environment.

The students at Havern School will soon enjoy a brand-new STEAM Makerspace! This space will give students the opportunity to explore hands-on activities and design challenges that integrate science, technology, engineering, art, and math. The space will help students build skills such as problem solving, creative thinking, and collaboration.



TEACHER TRAININGS:



For a second year in a row, the foundation will provide 10 scholarships for teachers to attend Marilyn Zecher's Multisensory Math Training at Hillside School in Boulder. This 5-day course applies the principles of the Orton-Gillingham methodology to transform math instruction into true math intervention.

The foundation will provide funds for cross-training between the teachers and staff at Hillside School in Boulder and coaches at Untapped Learning. The training sessions will bridge the gap between academic instruction and executive functioning skills and focus on how the two are interwoven in day-to-day activities inside and outside of the classroom.

The math teachers at **Humanex Academy** will continue their professional development classes, which are focused on teaching neurodivergent learners with the following learning challenges: dyscalculia, executive functioning skill deficits, and math anxiety.

SCHOLARSHIPS

The Zarlengo Foundation continues to provide funds to the Zarlengo Foundation Learning Evaluation Center to provide diagnostic testing for struggling students in Colorado.



In addition to the test results parents receive from the LEC, the psychologists also provide students with a one-page information sheet highlighting their strengths and weaknesses, which helps students learn how to self-advocate in school.
